Language placement tests

Applicants must sit a language placement test to determine their suitability for the course. Entry into these courses is subject to the successful passing of a placement tests. If the applicant's language skills are determined as being too advanced for their chosen language course (or do not meet the minimum language requirement for entry), the applicant may be given the opportunity to study an alternative UQ language course more appropriate to their language skill level. This is determined on a case-by-case basis, and is dependent on course and quota availability, and approval from the School of Languages and Cultures, the Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences Faculty, and UQ Admissions. Further information regarding placement test will be provided prior to enrolment.

Your application

Visit **esp.uq.edu.au** and check your eligibility. ESP applications are open to current Year 11 students in Queensland. For most courses, applicants must be achieving at a high level.

Before you apply, consider your school workload and whether you feel confident you can balance the extra study.
